Pumpkin Patch Questions & Answers

Where are the pumpkins coming from? We are getting our pumpkins from "Pumpkins USA" they have been in business for 33 years. Pumpkins USA only works with non-profits and faith communities. They deliver pumpkins in 48 states. They contract with the Navajo Native Americans to grow the pumpkins.

How much do the Pumpkins cost us?

Nothing. There are no up-front costs, or fees, and we are not responsible for the pumpkins we do not sell or are damaged. We typically give our left over Pumpkins to Tiger Haven here in Roane County. Pumpkins USA assumes all shipping and delivery costs. Every patch makes a profit. The company sets the pumpkin prices, we provide the time and the labor of selling, and then we get a percentage of the profit. We make 25-40% off the profits, depending open our gross sale.

When will they arrive?

The Pumpkins arrive on Sunday, September 28th and we will unload immediately after worship. Come dressed casually. This is during the Fall Festival, which is not the ideal, but the only time available for us We need LOTS of help to unload!

What are the hours of the Patch?

We will be open Monday – Saturday from 12pm -6pm. Closed on Sundays. We encourage volunteers to sign up in two hour time slots. Please consider signing up to help once a week.

How much do the pumpkins cost?

The prices for the pumpkins will be set according to size. They range from .50 to \$14.00 (and even higher for some especially large ones). Volunteers will not have to negotiate prices. You simply "size" a pumpkin according to size. We cannot discount for last days or bulk because doing that will only hurt our church's over-all profit & encourage more people to wait till the end of the month.

What does a volunteer do?

A volunteer should welcome folks into the patch. Explain that the pricing is based on size and answer any questions. You also help assist folks if need be in picking out the perfect pumpkin & take their money and make change. We welcome all ages to volunteer! We need lots of "Golden Pumpkin" Volunteers! Do you want to help with the decorating? Or have a wagon, trailer, or wheel barrow we can borrow for the month? Please call the Church, 354-1753. We'd love to have your ideas!

Dear Friends,

I was driving down the road the last week flipping through the radio channels when I heard it. It was a silly pop song popular in the mid-1990's and suddenly I wasn't driving down the road in my mini-van with two car seats behind me. I was back there. Still in my teens cruising down the road with my cousin Jackie as we drove with the windows down and the music loud as we belted out the words to that song. Suddenly a memory of the two of us slipping away from our grandparent's house and getting Frank's Frozen Custard on a late summer night came back to me. I teared up suddenly remembering that moment because I know now that was the last summer we'd have with Jackie. She was killed at sixteen in a car wreck one November afternoon while she was driving around town putting in job applications. But with that song I was suddenly back there with her laughing as we sang our hearts out together. I felt the ache of grief at how much our family and the world is less without the light that was Jackie Quandt in it. I thought of how much we miss her. Grief and loss isn't something we just one day get over, but more learn to live with...

It was that one song that did that to me. It was that one cheesy song whose band name I don't even remember that took me back. Music does that to us. I've seen a woman with advanced Alzheimer's who could not speak anymore walk up to a piano and play beautifully. Music can speak to us when words won't or can't. Music can stir our souls and make us in awe of all that is holy by just the sound in our ears. It stirs. Connect us across time and place and is intimately a part of our memories.

That's one of the reasons we are doing our special series, "God on your ipod" in September. We have asked you to tell us the songs of your life and during the month of September we will be incorporating many of them into worship. Special thanks to Janice Mitchell and the choir who will be working extra hard to make this happen for all of us. We are definitely stepping out of the box! It should be fun!

Our hope is that as you listen and sing a part of you will be connected to something bigger that yourself. We will look for the holy in the secular.
